THE COLLEGE:

The BSW College, established by Belgaum Integrated Rural development Society (BIRDS)-Naganur is a college imparting social work education at both Post graduate (MSW) and Undergraduate (BSW) level. The BIRD Society has been doing pioneering efforts in the field of education by organizing a Residential School for Rural Children from 01st to 10th standard, Integrated Education for Disabled Children, Pre-school education for small children, mainstreaming drop out children, running Community Learning Centers are few.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES:

- To provide first hand exposure to poverty, women and child development efforts,
- To impart professional skills of social work to youth at graduate level, to help them to analyze social structure and to contribute for social change,
- To provide manpower to work at grass root level in the field of social development,

UNIVERSITY AFFILIATION:

The college is started in 1991 with affiliation to Karnataka University, Dharwad and presently is affiliated to Rani Chennamma University, Belgavi since Sept 2010, and BSW degree is awarded by the same university.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

1. BSW is bachelors degree in social work instituted by Rani Chennamma University, Belgavi,
2. The degree is awarded to the students who satisfactorily complete three years course of studies (6 semesters) prescribed by the University and passes the examinations as per University rules,
3. Being an intensive course of studies and field work limited admission is permitted by the University.
4. A candidate who has passed the Pre-University Course conducted by the PUC Board of Karnataka or any other examinations considered equivalent is eligible for admission to BSW course. All students seeking

admission from outside the state of Karnataka should produce an eligibility certificate/migration certificate from Karnataka University,

5. Application for admission shall be made in the prescribed form available from the college office on payment of Rs.100/= (including prospectus)
 - 5a. Completed application form shall be submitted along with following documents:
 - 1) Xerox copy of SSLC marks card,
 - 2) Copy of PUC marks card or passing certificate,
 - 3) Passport size photo - 3,
 - 4) Caste and Income certificate (recent)
6. Being a full time course employed candidates will not be admitted,
7. Candidates will have to undergo following process for finalization of admission:
 - a. Group Discussion,
 - b. Personal Interview,

The decision of college will be final regarding admission process.

Selected candidates should complete their admission procedure with in the given time by producing originals of all documents and paying prescribed fees, delay in which will lead for laps of selection.

8. The preference will be given for candidates sponsored by social welfare agencies, industries, voluntary organizations and government departments.

COURSE CONTENT:

BSW is professional course at undergraduate level. Its curriculum consists of theory papers as well as social work practicum.

Theory papers are structured to provide basic understanding about society, social problems, human behavior, and economic system along with history, philosophy, values, principles, concepts, methods and techniques of social work practice.

Besides, students are required to carry out two days of faculty supervised field work per week through out each semester.

Practicum is designed to provide a variety of opportunity to develop and enhance professional practice skills. Learning is aided through observation, analyses of social realities and experience of participation in designing and providing social work intervention.

Besides one hour of individual conference per week and one hour of group conference once in fortnight shall be organized.

Student shall be required to submit field work report once a week to their faculty supervisor.

The course is spread over to 3 academic years of six semesters.

Evaluation:

There shall be university examination at the end of the each semester both for theory and social work practicum.

Duration of examination per theory paper of 80 marks shall be for three hours. Each theory paper shall comprise of three sections with first section 10 questions for 2 marks, second section 6 questions for 5 marks and third section 3 questions for 10 marks each.

Internal assessment shall be for 20 marks for theory and 10 marks for practicum, assessed through test for each paper and practicum separately.

Result of the student shall be declared as per university rules and regulation.

At the end of each semester social work practicum reports shall be assessed by a committee consisting of one internal and one external examiner.

THE INSTITUTION AND FACILITIES

1. Books recommended for BSW course and books for reference are procured and kept in the library. The library is well equipped with books and journals on various topics related to the course.
2. Attending in additional learning opportunity created for students like English class, evening class, samarasa vedike etc is compulsory for all the students. If they are found irregular, college will make note of that also.
3. The time table of filed work and lecture will be notified in advance and attendance will be strictly observed.
4. Attendance for class is compulsory for the students. Those who secure less than 75% attendance will be deprived of from attending the university examination.
5. Facilities for fee concession, Govt. of India, Post-metric scholarship, Merit scholarship, Disabled and Ex-servicemen scholarship will be made available to deserving candidates.
6. Well trained, experienced and qualified staffs are serving in the College.
7. The course is open both for boys and girls. The outstation students are expected to stay in the hostel located in BIRDS campus. The hostel provides boarding and lodging for students who wish to place them under supervision of college authorities. Here students receive assistance in their moral and intellectual formation as well.
8. Leave or absence from the college should be applied for and obtained before and unforeseen absence must be justified on return to the college. The college though not is responsible for conduct of its students outside the campus, will take cognizance of any mis-conduct.
9. There is NSS Unit which is lead under the leadership of eminent program officer. Interested students can enroll their names to NSS program also during time of admission.
10. All the students are also invited to join in the activities of Gandhi Study Center which is UGC supported program started by the college. Participation in the activities of the center is also mandatory for the students.

SOCIAL WORK PROFESSION AND ITS SCOPE:

The training for BSW is job oriented. Graduates qualified to work in communities, institutions for adults and children, non institutional services for children, hospitals, psychiatric clinics, correctional settings (Jails, observation home, etc), family welfare agencies, service for handicapped and governmental social welfare services.

On successful completion of his course, students with their own initiative and interest can undertake study projects or develop voluntary social agencies in the field of development, which can be funded by any private or government agencies.
